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### **Nantucket Guide**

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Grocery stores: There are two large grocery stores on the island: Stop & Shop and the Grand Union. The best time to avoid the crowds is early in the morning and on weekdays. The Grand Union is in town, near the ferry wharf; parking is extremely limited. For the Stop & Shop (about ¾ mile) take Pine Street away from town, turn right on Lyon Street, turn left on Pleasant Street, a slight right onto Atlantic Avenue and left on Sparks Avenue.

- For specialty or organic foods go to Fahey & Fromagerie at 49A Pleasant Street (508-325-5644) or Annys's Whole Foods at 95 Washington Street (508-228-4554).
- Sayle's Seafood fish market is located at 99 Washington Street (508-228-4599) and Glidden's Island Seafood is located 115 Pleasant Street (508-228-0912).
- The butcher shop is Cowboy's Meat Market & Delicatessen - 7 Bayberry Court (508-228-8766).

Drugstores: On Main Street, Nantucket Pharmacy (508-228-0180) or Congdon's (508-228-0020)

Bakery / coffee / paper: Nantucket Bake Shop - 79 Orange (508-228-2797, closed on Sundays). The Bean - 29 Centre Street (508-228-6862). For newspapers go to The Hub - 31 Main Street (508-325-0200)

Beer / wine / spirits: Next to the Stop & Shop; Murray's Beverage Store - 23 Main (508-228-0071). Liquor stores are closed on Sunday.

Video rentals: Nantucket Video - 32 Main Street (508-228-0101)

Flowers: Flowers on Chestnut -1 Chestnut Street (508-228-6007)

Internet access: Even Keel Café - 40 Main Street (508-228-1979) has internet access for \$4 (15 minutes), \$8 (30 minutes), \$15 (1 hour)

Restaurants: Please note that all dining on Nantucket is smoke-free. The restaurants below represent just a few of the many, many dining options within walking distance from the house. While even the finer restaurants on Nantucket do not necessarily require a tie, a jacket for men may be suggested, so calling ahead to inquire about proper attire is recommended.

Sweets: Aunt Leah's Fudge - the Courtyard on Straight Wharf (508-228-1017); The Juice Bar - 12 Broad Street (508-228-5799) for homemade ice cream

Transportation on island: Traffic in the summer on Nantucket can be challenging. From 36 Pine you can walk or bike anywhere. In addition, as a one-way street going out of town, the street tends to be quieter than most streets.

- Bicycle rental (Young's (508-228-1151) and the Nantucket Bike Shop (508-228-1999)) are both just off the ferry wharf on Broad Street.
- For a \$2 fare, NRTA runs shuttles all over the island, which leave from Washington / Salem Streets every 1/2 hour between the hours of 7am to 11:30pm during the summer season (508-228-7025). For more details on routes and fares for the NRTA shuttle, look in the "Nantucket Information" folder for the Rider's Guide on the bookshelf above the kitchen desk.
- Rental cars can be reasonable if you book early. Some options include: Affordable Car Rental: 508-228-3501 (wharf), Nantucket Car Rental: 508-228-7474 (wharf), Budget Rental: 508-228-5666 (airport) and Hertz Rental: 508-228-9421 (airport).
- There are multiple taxi options, including: A-1 Taxi (508-228-3330), Around Nantucket Taxi (508-325-5508) and Val's Cab Service (508-228-9410). For a complete list of taxis and fares, look in the "Nantucket Information" folder on the bookshelf above the kitchen desk.

Sightseeing: The newly renovated Whaling Museum at 15 Broad Street (508-228-1894), Nantucket Lifesaving Museum at 158 Polpis Road (508-228-1885) and the Nantucket Lightship Basket Museum at 49 Union Street (508-228-1177) are great for a rainy day. Nantucket Vineyard / Cisco Brewers - 5 & 7 Bartlett Farm Road have tours by appointment (508-325-5929).

Movie theatre: The Starlight – 1 Union Street (508-228-4435)

Beaches: There are a number of wonderful beaches on Nantucket, and several are within walking distance of 36 Pine Street.

- *Brant Point Beach:* This is a scenic beach with the Brant Point Lighthouse and wonderful harbor views; however, there is no lifeguard on duty and strong currents require experienced swimmers.
- *The Harbor Beach (Children's Beach):* Ideal for small children, with a park, playground, game tables, and bandstand. A lifeguard is on duty and there are restrooms, showers, a restaurant and take-out food service. Tie-dying sponsored by the Park & Recreation Commission happens here Fridays at noon, from mid-July through the end of August.
- *Francis Street Beach:* While there is no lifeguard on duty, this beach boasts the calm harbor waters for swimming. There is also a Jungle Jim, kayak rentals and bathrooms.
- *Jetties Beach:* This beach is a short bike ride from town. There are lifeguards, changing rooms, a playground, volleyball nets, restrooms, showers, public phones, a restaurant and take-out food service, as well as tennis, windsurfing, sailboat, and kayak rentals. Swimming lessons for children age 6 and up offered by the Park & Recreation Commission run July 4 through Labor Day from 9:30 a.m. to 12 noon.

Outdoor activities:

- *Golf:* There are two public courses on the island. Miacomet Golf Course is Nantucket's only year round public golf course, located about a mile from the south shore in the central part of the island. An 18 hole course, it offers a driving range, golf shop and restaurant (508-325-0333) (<http://www.miacometgolf.com/>). Siasconset Golf Course is a 9-hole course open seasonally off the Milestone Road (508-257-6596).
- *Tennis:* Jetties Beach has six public tennis courts. Prices vary depending on whether singles or doubles are being played. Reservations are not required, but are recommended (508-325-5334).
- *Sailing:* Through Nantucket Community Sailing anyone can take lessons, and with enough experience, rent a sailboat from the group's Jetties Beach location. In the summer youth sailing lessons are offered from both the Jetties Beach and Polpis Harbor locations. Sign-ups begin in the spring, and classes fill up early. - *Surfing:* The south shore is a popular year-round surfing spot for many islanders. Indian Summer - Steamboat Wharf (508-228 3632), Force Five - 6 Union Street (508-228 0700) and Nantucket Island Surf School on Cisco Beach (508-560-1020) (<http://www.surfack.com/>) provide equipment and lessons.
